Encounter wild animals in their majestic natural settings with Trails of Africa Tours and Safaris.

The following itinerary is an example of one of the many tours available to tour in Kenya. Please enquire for any further options as well as tailor-made tours for individuals and groups.

Across Kenya Signature Safari (8 Days)

Day 1: Arrive Nairobi, Kenya

After arriving in Nairobi's Jomo Kenyatta International Airport, and a warm welcome by airport representative, travel to the hotel for the evening.

Overnight at either of the following hotels, booked on Bed and Breakfast;

- Standard Hotels Option include Sentrim Boulevard Hotel, Gracia similar
- Luxury Hotels Option include Sarova Panafric Hotel, Nairobi Boma Inn or similar

Meals – only Breakfast in Nairobi. Lunch and dinner pay direct

Day 2: Aberdares National Park

After breakfast, depart for the Aberdares National Park. Enjoy lunch at the either the Outspan Country Club or Aberdares Country Club. After lunch, continue to the Aberdares National Park and upon arrival, check in at the Tree Tops Lodge. Enjoy watching wildlife from the hotel terrace for the afternoon and evening.

Overnight at either of the following hotels, which are booked on full board basis

- Standard Hotels Option include Ark Lodge or similar
- Luxury Hotels Option include Tree Tops Lodge or similar

Meals - Breakfast at Nairobi; Lunch and Dinner in Nakuru

Day 3: Samburu Game Reserve

After breakfast, travel further north to Samburu Game Reserve. Following lunch, continue the journey to Samburu, arriving in the late afternoon in time for a late game drive in search of the rarely found species of wild game; the rare reticulated giraffe, Grevy's zebra, the long necked gerenuk antelopes, Beisa Oryx, blue flanked Somali ostrich, vulturine guinea fowl as well as more common wildlife such as, lion, leopard and plenty of other game animal.

Overnight at either of the following hotels, which are booked on Full Board Basis;

Meals - Breakfast in Aberdares; Lunch and Dinner in Samburu

Day 4: Samburu Game Reserve

Enjoy a full day of African game viewing and bird watching. The Samburu Game Reserve offers Kenya's greatest and most consistent encounter with the wild Africa of yesteryear. This harsh, savagely beautiful wilderness is dependant on the steady flow of the Uaso Nyiro River for its existence. The rivers water house a wide variety of animal species not found south of the Equator including Beisa Oryx, the reticulated giraffe, the thin-striped Grevy's zebra, and the 'giraffe-necked' gerenuk antelope, which stands on its hind legs to feed. Elephant, buffalo, lion and leopard can all be seen along the river. Over 400 species of bird complete the perfect experience in Samburu. This is the home of the Samburu tribe, cousins of the Maasai, who share the same nomadic, cattle-herding existence, and an even stricter



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adherence to their age-old rites and customs.

Overnight at either of the following hotels which are booked on Full Board Basis;

- Luxury Hotels Option include Sarova Shaba Game Lodge or similar

Meals – Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner in Samburu

Day 5: Lake Nakuru National Park

Following breakfast at the lodge, depart for Lake Nakuru National Park with a lunch stopover in Nyahururu or Nanyuki town. Arrive in Nakuru and head straight for an afternoon game drive in the park. The Park is renowned worldwide for its myriad of pink flamingo. Lake Nakuru is a shallow alkaline lake in Kenya's Rift Valley and some 62 km² in extent. In late 80's the park also became Kenya's first rhino sanctuary and is today home to both the White and Black Rhinos. Lions, leopards, hippos, giraffes, waterbucks are equally at home in this unique park.

Overnight at either of the following hotels which are booked on Full Board Basis;

- Standard Hotels Option include Capital Hill Hotel or Hill Top or similar hotel
- Luxury Hotels Option include Sarova Shaba Game Lodge or similar

Meals: Breakfast in Samburu, Lunch and Dinner at Nakuru

Day 6: Maasai Mara Game Reserve

Following breakfast, drive to the Maasai Mara Game Reserve. After arrival, enjoy lunch before embarking for an afternoon game drive. The Maasai Mara is host to the most spectacular array of wildlife such as lion, elephant, cheetah, leopard, rhino, giraffe, gazelle and zebras among others. Game viewing is never dull in the Mara and patience is often rewarded with unique sightings: a pride of lion stalking their prey, a solitary leopard retrieving its kill from the high branches of an Acacia tree, a male wildebeest sparring to attract females into their harem or a herd of elephant protecting their young from opportunistic predators.

Overnight at either of the following hotels which are booked on Full Board Basis;

- Standard Hotels Option include Kichakani Camp or Kimana Camp Mara or similar
- Luxury Hotels Option include Mara Sopa Lodge or Keekorok Lodge or similar

Meals – Breakfast in Nakuru, Lunch and Dinner in Nairobi

Day 7: Maasai Mara Game Reserve

A full day is spent exploring the natural wonder of the Maasai Mara. A visit to the Mara River, where the famous wildebeest migration takes place, allow for the sightings of both hippo and crocodile, coexisting in the same waters. A vast reserve of endless flat grassland, crossed by rivers which play host to wildlife's most spectacular moments, the Maasai Mara is Kenya's most popular safari destination, renowned for the Wildebeest Migration, when vast hordes of Wildebeest roar through the park bringing in its trail a wake of mighty predators.

at an additional cost of \$20, an afternoon visit to a Maasai Cultural Village is optional. Here, join the Maasai dancers as they don their African regalia and commence in traditional dance. From the sound of jingling on their feet, to the rhythm of the African drumbeats, dance to their tunes that will leave you refreshed.

Overnight at either of the following hotels, which are booked on Full Board Basis;

- Standard Hotels Option include Kichakani Camp or Kimana Camp Mara or similar
- Luxury Hotels Option include Mara Sopa Lodge or Keekorok Lodge or similar

Meals – Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner in Maasai Mara

Day 8: Depart Nairobi

After breakfast, return Nairobi. After a stop for lunch (pay direct) enjoy a last minute shop for souvenirs before being transferred to Jomo Kenyatta International Airport in time to check in for your return flight back home.
